

Beanie Cabecinhos

Sizes:

- **Teenager** / **Adult S** 43 cm long x 28.5 cm high, with a head circumference of 54 cm.
- **Adult M** 45.5 cm long x 29.5 cm high, with a head circumference of 56cm.
- Adult L/XL 48 cm long x 30.5 cm high with a head circumference of 58/60 cm.

Materials:

- 9,00mm crochet hook
- 1 ball of 100gram skein of wool (135 meters aprox.) 100% acrylic, medium thickness (the amount may vary depending on the brand of wool, the dye itself or the stitch tension, I recommend having 1 extra ball of yarn.)
- 1 ball of another color of wool with equivalent thickness for pompom
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors
- Crochet markers
- Pompom machine (optional)
- Crochet round counters (opcional)



Abbreviations:

- $\mathbf{R} = Round(\mathbf{s})$
- Ch = Chains
- Sl St = Slip Stitch
- **Hdc** = Half Double Crochet
- **Bp hdc** = Half Double Crochet in the back loop only
- **Bp Sl St** = Slip Stitch in the back loop only
- Rep = Repeat * til the end
- * = Repeat directions between * and * as many times indicated



Sample:

10 single crochet X 11 rows in height

- = 10 cm X 10 cm with 9,00mm needle.
- The size of the crochet hook is given for guidance only! If your sample has too many stitches for 10 cm, try crocheting with a thicker hook. If your sample doesn't have enough stitches for 10cm, try crocheting with a thinner hook.

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Notes:

Instructions are written for Teen / Adult size S (43 cm length x 28.5 cm height).

• To make lager sizes, simply add to the base number of chains and increase the number of rounds from 3 to 30 until you get the right size in cm, described in the size chart from the first page.

Instructions:

- For Teen / Adult size S Beanie.
- Use crochet markers at the beginning and end os rounds. This way you don't confuse the rising chains with stitches.

R1: 31 ch.



R2: Skip the first chain, and in the second chain from de hook do 27 Bp hdc, 3 Bp sl st. 1 ch, turn. (the chain doest count as a stitch). There will be a total of 30 back loops stitches.







Place crochet markers on both ends and a 3rd marker to indicate the right side of the beanie -

R 3: 3 Bp sl st, 27 Bp hdc, 1 chain, turn.



R 4 - 30: Repeat the sequence of round 2 to 3. Or in this case, until the work measures 54cm long.

R 31: 1 ch to finish.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing the two sides of the beanie.



Finish:

- Join the two sides of the beanie, with the marker placed to indicate the right side of the beanie facing inward, and sew from the base of the beanie (where we have the thread for sewing) to the top (where are the slip stitches), catching the back loop on one side and the hole on the other one. Repeat this process until you reach the top.




• After the sides are sewn, tie a knot with the thread left over from the beginning of our work. This way we ensure that when we continue sewing the top of the beanie, we do not pull all the seam just done.

Don't cut the thread yet!



• Take only the loops that come out of the previously slip stitches, all around the hole, tighten and finish with tow or tree knots.







• Fasten off and weave the ends.





Using a pompom machine (or manually), make one big pompom and place it on the top of the beanies. Or make tow smaller ones and place them side by side. You can also leave with nothing on.







Place the pompom as centered as is possible on the top of the beanie and tie two knots or make a bow so that it can be removable, for example.
